Multi-Agency Deep Dive Audit into how agencies safeguard children subject to a Private Fostering Arrangement, March 2021

7 POINT BRIEFING

SUMMARY

Wakefield Safeguarding Children Partnership (WSCP) carried out a deep dive multi-agency audit into how agencies safeguard children subject to a Private Fostering (PF) Arrangement. The audit considered seven children who were subject to an arrangement.



WHAT IS PRIVATE FOSTERING?

Private Fostering is when a child under the age of 16 years old (under 18 if disabled) is cared for by someone who is not their birth parent or a close relative. This is a private arrangement made between a parent and a carer for 28 days or more.

Under the Private Fostering Arrangements (2005), any professional who comes into contact with children, are under a duty to inform the local authority about any private fostering arrangements they are made aware of.



AUDIT FINDINGS - AREAS WORKING WELL

- Children subject to a PF arrangement were safe and the placement appropriate
- Birth parents were in agreement and supportive of the arrangements
- Agencies were notified by Children's Social Care when a child became subject to a PF arrangement
- Carers were very supportive of contact with the birth family
- Assessments were complete and processes in place to update annually
- Support services were in place or offered to children and carers
- Children's views demonstrated some good examples of direct work with children
- Child in Need meetings were carried out and involved multi-agencies
- During Covid-19 restrictions, face-to-face visits by support services was maintained



AUDIT FINDINGS - AREAS FOR DEVELOPMENT

- Within some of the cases, there were late notification of the private fostering arrangement by agencies involved was noted.
- Within a small proportion of cases timeliness in the completion of the private fostering assessment could have been improved.
- In cases where a child has been subject to PF arrangements for a long period, practitioners should be reminded of the need to advise carers of the potential to seek parental responsibility through the appropriate means.
- Practitioners in some cases may need to be reminded of the importance of notifying and seeking medical consent of the birth family where parental responsibly remains.
- Within some cases, multi-agency work would have been strengthened where the GP was notified of meetings and requested to provide updates to plans.
- In the event of a child returning to birth family, practitioners are reminded to communicate effectively to consider any medium / long term arrangements for support arising from prior separation.
- Practice may be further strengthened by a learning and development approach which focuses on attention on loss, trauma, cultural and racial difference within private

fostering cases.



- WSCP will consider the key learning points from this audit:
- All services who work with children and families to ensure workforce understands what Private Fostering is and how to respond should they suspect a child is being privately fostered
- Services to ensure GPs are notified a child is being privately fostered and included in multi-agency working such as meetings and planning
- Services to consider how Private Fostering as an area can be overseen and developments monitored more effectively across the district
- Build Our Futures Group to explore how children subject to a Private Fostering Arrangement can share their voice and views
- WSCP Learning & Development Sub-group to seek assurance resources and training available for children and families workforce is appropriate and develop as required



NEXT STEPS

The findings of the audit have been shared with the WSCP Safeguarding Effectiveness Group and key multi-agency actions have been identified for services to implement.
