

West Yorkshire Youth Commission 2025:

Application Guidance Notes

1. What is the Youth Commission?

The Youth Commission enables young people to inform and support, the work of the Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP) for West Yorkshire. The project allows young people to get involved and have their say about Violence & Exploitation where they live.

2. Who can join the West Yorkshire Youth Commission?

We are looking for participants **aged 14-25 years** who are currently resident of the West Yorkshire policing area. The role is open to anyone in this age group living in West Yorkshire.

We are particularly seeking application from those aged 14-17

In total, we are seeking to recruit up to 20/25 young people. We are looking for people who will be good team players, who will be committed to the project and willing to do all the activities involved. We are also very keen to ensure that the Youth Commission is made up of a diverse group of young people who broadly reflect the makeup of the local population, including those who may have direct experience of the police and justice system.

3. If I join, what will I have to do?

Between July 2025 and March 2026, members of the Youth Commission will:

- Take part in Youth Commission sessions: You will participate in Youth Commission meetings. (These will be a mixture of in-person and online).
- Take part in a special project to advise the VRP on what services and support children
 and young people need: You will advise the VRP on what services young people in your
 local community need, and what barriers they face in accessing them.







- **Gather the views of other young people:** You will be given support to carry out peer research with other young people in schools, colleges, universities and youth groups to understand their opinions and experiences of youth services. This can be done to suit your schedule and can fit around your existing commitments.
- Promote the Youth Commissions 'I took a seat...' campaign: Continue to share the Youth Commissions' 'I took a seat...' Campaign on Attitudes and Violence Towards Women and Drugs Gangs and Knife Crime with other young people across West Yorkshire.
- Plan events: You will work in a team to design and plan interactive workshops to engage
 other young people and partner agencies in your area. You will be invited to help to run
 these events wherever possible as long as there is no clash with your school/ college
 commitments.
- Report back to the office of the VRP: You will contribute towards the analysis of information gathered from young people in your area and help to present back your conclusions to the VRP
- **Help to host the Youth Commission Conference:** You will have the opportunity to present your findings and recommendations and be a part of discussions with key decision-makers from the VRP, the West Yorkshire Police, partner agencies and other young people.

4. What will I get from being part of the Youth Commission?

- **Discuss issues with the VRP, police and key partners:** You will meet key decision makers and the VRP, police and other partners at Youth Commission events and help them to understand what services and support young people in your area need.
- **Develop your skills and experience:** You will gain valuable skills and experience, which you will be able to use for your CV or applications to Further or Higher Education.
- **Become a voice for other young people:** You will give a voice to young people in your area by helping them to get their views heard.







• **Meet new people:** You will meet a diverse range of other young people from the West Yorkshire area, and work alongside professionals from different organisations.
