What services will do next


- Share knowledge with colleagues / staff on local trends, signs and how to handle the situation better
- Share knowledge on drugs awareness to parents
- Use the additional learning to increase identification of drug use in young people
- Improving how I identify risks, support young people through informed conversations and promote safer choices
- Be more aware when our pupils and their parents are talking about concerns for their older children/siblings
- Improve staff confidence to know signs of exposure, handling, or misuse appropriate to primary age pupils
- Ensure utilising PIP more and ensure wider staff are aware of substances and their effects
- Deliver awareness sessions in school to our students



Changes in knowledge

Users reported before the training their knoweldge was 5.5/10 AFTER the training this had increased by 3.2 points to an average of 8.8/10
